Indianapolis, Indiana – Members of Zeta Phi Beta Sorority, Inc. traveled to Indianapolis to take part in their Zeta Organizational Leadership (ZOL) Conference. Zeta's national leadership conference convened July 18-21, 2013. Over 1,100 members (graduate and undergraduate) and Amicae (Friends) attended intense training that was designed to enhance leadership skills and provides members with provide members with the essential training, knowledge and skills to be exceptional leaders in both Zeta Phi Beta and in their personal/professional life. This year's ZOL Leadership Conference, experienced the largest attendance since the beginning of this national program in 2005. Over 800 participants alone were enrolled in the certification phase. Certification participants were exposed to an advanced study guide and had to complete a leadership behavior assessment prior to the conference.

These members are also pursuing ZOL Certification. Leadership Certification will be granted to members with the successful completion of leadership curriculum and advanced course of study. Obtaining this certification is highly recommended for members to hold nationally elected and appointed positions.
